Panama Matariki 2024

The Panama Riverside Matariki event was a resounding success, achieved through several key factors, including effective use of funding, engaging activities, and strong community participation. The funding received from Te Puni Kokiri, Mercury Energy, and the DIA played a crucial role in achieving the event's objectives. Feedback indicated a significant boost in awareness and understanding of Matariki, a cornerstone in Māori culture symbolizing the Māori New Year. The event's hands-on learning experiences, such as traditional crafts, storytelling, and Waka Ama paddling, fostered a deeper appreciation for Māori traditions (mātauranga) and promoted active participation and cultural engagement. This not only strengthened community ties but also sparked interest among youth to join

local cultural clubs, demonstrating a lasting impact on community involvement. The event, which attracted 400-500 residents, created a welcoming and inclusive environment, fostering a sense of unity and shared identity. The positive response and anticipation for future events have laid a solid foundation for continued cultural celebrations and enhanced community well-being. Overall, the Matariki event successfully met its goals of community education, cultural engagement, and promoting unity, demonstrating the effectiveness of combining meaningful cultural activities with strategic funding support.

Panama Riverside Community Plan

The Panama Riverside Community Plan (2024-2034) outlines a strategic framework to transform Panama Riverside into a vibrant, inclusive, and sustainable community. Addressing challenges such as inadequate facilities, limited green spaces, and a need for more youth and adult engagement programs, the plan sets both short-term and long-term objectives. Key initiatives include renovating the community hall, revitalizing local shops, creating temporary and permanent green spaces, enhancing youth programs, and improving public transport. The plan also focuses on economic revitalization, fostering community engagement, promoting mental health, and integrating technology. Do you want community assets sold?

On July 24th the Mount Wellington Licensing Trust (MWLT) announced the Sale of the Panmure Historic Hotel and the Waipuna Hotel and Conference Centre. The MWLT controls the Mount Wellington Trust Hotels Ltd who manage the hotels. We are petitioning the Trustees to immediately halt the proposed sale on the grounds that the Board members did not at any time seek a mandate from the community.
